Ongoing Winter Storm

A few rain/snow showers began last night and diminished throughout the overnight hours. Precipitation is expected to pick up today and continue throughout the next few days. The main push from this low-pressure system will be Tuesday into Wednesday, with the heaviest precipitation expected during this time. Multiple winter weather products have been issued due to the passing of this storm system. The increase in precipitation will elevate stream/river/creek flows once again. Areas south of the Mogollon Rim will be more susceptible to flooding concerns. As a result, there is also a Flood Watch valid from midday Tuesday through Wednesday evening for lower elevations of Yavapai County and northern Gila County.

KEY POINTS

- A Winter Storm Warning remains in effect for areas above 7000 feet along the Kaibab Plateau.
- A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect now through 2 PM MST/ 3 PM MDT Tuesday for areas above 7000 feet along the Chuska Mountains and Black Mesa.
- A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect from midnight tonight through 2 PM MST Tuesday for areas above 6500 along the Coconino Plateau and western Mogollon Rim
- Scattered to widespread rain/snow showers will continue throughout the day today.
- More widespread rain/snow showers are forecast to begin Tuesday morning and continue throughout Wednesday.
- A Flood Watch is in effect from midday Tuesday through Wednesday evening for lower elevations south of the Mogollon Rim.
- Uncertainty remains with snow levels for the Tuesday/Wednesday portion of this system, but areas above 6500 feet could see significant snowfall accumulation..
- Strong southwesterly winds anticipated Tuesday and Wednesday with 40+ mph gusts in the forecast.
- Enhanced flooding will be a concern with the additional precipitation through midweek.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

- The Winter Storm Warning for the Kaibab Plateau was extended through 5 PM MST Wednesday.
- A Winter Weather Advisory has been issued for areas above 7000 feet along the Chuska Mountains and Black Mesa from now through 2 PM MST/ 3 PM MDT Tuesday.
- A **Winter Weather Advisory** has been issued for areas above 6500 feet along the Coconino Plateau and the western Mogollon Rim from midnight tonight through 2 PM MST Tuesday.


















Expected Precipitation (Rainfall + Melted Snowfall) - Official NWS Forecast
