Temp Youth Equestrian Permit	NO PROVISIONS	 Purpose of keeping horses and livestock to participate in equestrian activities including but not limited to, rodeo, mounted shooting, reined cow horse, cutting, dressage, or any other equestrian activity within an organization that has a youth membership/competition component. Active member in an equestrian organization, and under the age of twenty (20). Youth reside, or the livestock is cared for on a parcel of land that is (1/2) acre or more, but the livestock needed to successfully

participate would exceed the number of animals allowed on the parcel according to

Nuisances	 All structures and pens for animals shall be maintained in a clean and slightly manner so as not to be a nuisance to their neighbors. Stables, barns, or structures used for housing or feeding animals must observe the same setbacks or yards as the dwelling unit. Rear setback exception for those lots abutting National Forest Service, Trust Land and BLM. Provision for reduction of animals by Code Enforcement. Removal that constitutes a health or safety hazard to human beings is necessary to comply with the current Town Code. 	 Livestock pens, stalls, shelters, cages, or other similar enclosures used for confining animals on a temporary or permanent basis shall meet the same setbacks as the dwelling unit. Yard or pasture areas that allow animals to roam outside defined enclosures are excluded from the setback requirements. Livestock pens, stalls, shelters, cages, areas, composting bins/piles, places, and premises where they are held or kept, shall be maintained so that flies, insects, vermin, rodents, odors, ponded water, the accumulation of manure, garbage, refuse, rubbish, trash, or others noxious materials do not become a public health nuisance.
Other Limitations	NO PROVISIONS	 The maximum combined animal point count for any combination of Non-resident animals, Guest Animals, Youth-Equestrian Permits, and Administrative Review Permits may not exceed 200% of base animal point count. Youth Livestock non-eligible if combination exceeds 200%.
Manure Removal, Storage and Containment	• NO PROVISIONS	 Animal/livestock manure removed at least 2x times per week (Pens, stalls, yards, cages, other enclosures). 200-foot setback for manure mound storage or animal waste. Mound max. 5 ft high/5 ft across, 1 per parcel. Manure storage to be in covered container(s), mulched/disced in pasture lands, or properly composted. Container(s) must meet dwelling unit setbacks. Container(s) must be kept clean, in good repair and always covered. Containment on property to not allow run off Water Troughs/Tank provisions for adequate facilities for draining the overflow, to prevent ponding of water, the breeding of flies, mosquitoes, or other insects or health hazards.
