

THURSDAY OCTOBER 04, 2012 - SPECIAL SESSION

Roll Call Chairman Joe Butner, Vice Chairman Blue, Commissioners, Hisrich, Parrish, Norton, Freeman and Hough were present.

THURSDAY DECEMBER 06, 2012 - REGULAR SESSION

Roll Call: Vice Chairman Blue, Commissioners Hisrich, Norton, and Hough were present. Chairman Butner, Commissioner Freeman and Parrish were absent.

Also attending: Community Development Director Mike Jenkins, and Recording Secretary Jenna Owens.

THE FOLLOWING RECOMMENDATIONS WERE MADE TO COUNCIL: October 04. 2012

Public Hearing, Discussion and Possible Recommendation to Council for Text Amendments to the Town of Camp Verde Planning & Zoning Ordinance under Part Three, Section 306 title, and subsections A-D. To (1) change the agency responsible for issuing a Mobile Home Rehabilitation permit from the Town of Camp Verde to the Arizona Department of Fire. Building and Life Safety, Office of Manufactured Housing, (2) remove the allowance to transfer or install within Town limits, a Mobile Home previously outside the Town Limits, (3) remove the allowance to transfer or install within the Town limits, a Manufactured Home with a manufacture date greater than 20 years, from the date of application submittal, that was previously outside the Town of Camp Verde Town Limits, and (4) Changing Section 306 title to read "Mobile/Manufactured Home Standards" and including installation and maintenance standards for manufactured homes installed on private tracts of land or lots outside of a Mobile Manufactured Home Park.

Commissioner Hough opened the discussion with the suggestion to make the following amendments to the Planning & Zoning Ordinance under Part Three, Section 306, with the suggested amendments shown in underlined bold type, as follows: Page 2, Paragraph A.2.a. (in part) ".....except for existing <u>legally permitted</u> manufactured homes...." On Page 4, Paragraph C.1.b.1) (In part) ".....except for existing manufactured homes that are currently located and <u>legally permitted</u> within the Town limits."

Butner requested from Community Development Director Jenkins and Building Official Foreman clarification of what type of permit does "legally permitted" refer to. Foreman explained the factors involved in issuing a permit to set the

manufactured home, which is the same as the installation permit, and finally the issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy. After further discussion the Commissioners arrived at a consensus for additional language, and action was taken accordingly.

November 01, 2012

Public hearing, Discussion and Possible Recommendation to Council for a Use Permit to continue an Off Premise Sign that is located on parcel 403-25-023 owned by Leslie Friedlander and is being requested by owners John Otto & Marlin Warkentin of Otto Bond & Bail, LLC. The property is located at 2931 Commonwealth Drive in the Verde Valley Business Park next to the Yavapai Co. Justice Facility.

On a motion by Freeman, seconded by Norton, the Commission unanimously recommended that Council approve a Use Permit to continue the use of an Off Premise Sign for a period of five (5) years from the date of the Town Council approval as required by Part 4 Section 404.D of the Planning & Zoning Ordinance, for an Off Premise sign located on Parcel 403-25-023, owned by Leslie Friedlander, as requested by John Otto & Marlin Warkentin, owners of Otto Bond & Bail, LLC, with all seven stipulations as they are listed, with the addition to No. 4, "as long as the sign Use Permit is in effect."

Asst. Planner Owens reviewed the background of the request for a Use Permit to continue the subject existing Off Premise sign that was originally approved by Council for a period of three years, with certain stipulations, which Owens outlined. The Town Code allows Use Permits to be granted for a period of five years. Since the original installation of the Off Premise sign, no complaints have been received, and the applicant is now requesting to continue the sign in place for a five-year period. The required notices were sent and public meeting held, with no neighbors in attendance. Owens also referred to the Land Use Application Form, copies of which were included in the Agenda packet, together with supporting documentation and photos. Owens noted that according to the Town Clerk, a Town of Camp Verde Business License is not required, as had been originally stipulated, since the business is basically a service that is not subject to that requirement.

The Commissioners discussed the subject application; Owens confirmed that the applicant maintains an office in the Fort Verde Plaza. In response to further questions, Marlin Warkentin stated that they do have a current Business License in place, and plan to continue to keep it in force throughout the requested Use Permit period. The Commissioners indicated they were generally in favor of continuing to require a Business License and, based on the history of no complaints, would also favor approving the request for a five-year Use Permit period. It was agreed that the subject request should be recommended for approval and that the stipulation requiring a business license be continued, with addition of the following language: "... as long as the sign Use Permit is in effect."

December 06, 2012

Public hearing, discussion and possible recommendation to Council on an application submitted by the Gregory Blue, owner of parcel 404-26-032, requesting a Zoning Map Change, project # 20120238, to go from R1-10 (Residential) to RS (Residential and Services) for approximately 1.37 acres located at 671 S. 4th St.

Vice Chairman Blue has formally recused himself from this item.

On a motion by Hough, seconded by Hisrich, this item is to be continued until the January 6, 2013 meeting and be first on the agenda due to a lack of quorum after recusal. The motion was unanimously approved.



Background Information: In 2000, Council approved \$50 per month for Council members to cover incidental expenses incurred by members. In 2001, a Resolution was approved declaring the \$50 as a salary. Expenses have increased greatly over the past 13 years, while Council's salary has remained static at \$50 per month. The out-of-pocket expenses, such as fuel, dinners, events, internet, and other incidental expenses incurred by Council members may discourage potential candidates from running for office. The 2012 League Salary & Benefit Survey indicates that Cottonwood Council members receive \$500 per month and Sedona Council members receive \$450, while their Mayors receive \$750 and \$650, respectively. Staff realizes that even these amounts are insufficient to cover many expenses that Council members incur on behalf of the Town.

Staff is seeking direction as to whether Council feels that it is appropriate to consider an increase in your monthly salary. If so, this is the time for consideration, as the budget process will soon begin. Staff suggests that Council consider at least ½ of what Cottonwood & Sedona receive. Please note that ARS prohibits voting for an increase for yourselves. If approved, the increase would not take place until the new Council is seated in June.

Recommended Action (Motion): Direct staff to prepare a resolution increasing Council salary to an amount determined by Council and bring the resolution back to the next meeting for consideration.
