Agenda Title (be exact): Discussion, consideration, and possible direction to staff to prepare an ordinance drafting the conditions of the sale and/or use of fireworks within the Town limits.
Purpose and Background Information: On December 1, 2010, a state-wide law was enacted that allowed the sale of certain types of fireworks. The law allows communities to regulate the use of some or all of these fireworks. An example is attached to the agenda packet. Also attached for Council's information is a spreadsheet indicating what other communities have done.
Staff is seeking Council direction relative to setting policy regarding the use of fireworks. After Council's discussion, an ordinance will be prepared based on Council direction. Public input should be taken prior to the approval of the ordinance.
 Currently, the statutes allow the sale of certain types of fireworks. The process currently in place is as follows: The vendor completes a business license application. The Town Code does not have a provision that permits the waiver of license fees for any type of organization. The application is forwarded to the Community Development Department to ensure zoning compliance; to the Camp Verde Fire District for fire code instructions; and to the Marshal's Office for the purposes of notification. The application is held in the Community Development Department until such time as the Building Official determines all requirements have been met. If approved, the Building Official and the Fire District sign the back of the application. The application is returned to the Clerk's Office. The Clerk's Office checks the application for signatures and special considerations, and contacts the vendor, and if applicable advises the vendor of the special considerations, collects appropriate fees, and issues the certificate. The Clerk's Office enters the information from the application into the data base.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Do I need a business license to sell fireworks?
 Yes, all organization, companies, persons conducting sales within the Town limits must have and display a current Business License.
- What are the Town's guidelines with regard to business licenses, transaction privilege tax licenses, and other existing permits relative to temporary venues?

Chapter 9 of the Town Code regulates business conducted within the Town limits. Simply stated:


- 1. It is unlawful for anyone to conduct business in the Town limits without a business license.
- 2. No vendor can locate on public property.
- 3. No vendor can locate on private property without first providing written consent from the owner of record.
- 4. License certificate must be posted at all times and is non-transferrable.
- 5. A Certificate of Compliance must be issued by the Building Official for all new businesses, excluding home-based occupations, before a business license can be issued.
- 6. All fees must be paid prior to the issuance of the license certificate.
- 7. The Marshal's Office enforces compliance, with each day constituting a separate offense.


Temporary venues in which business is conducted during special events are covered in the Special Event Policy and Handbook approved and adopted by Council on 3-10-10.

- What is the Town policy regarding non-profit organizations selling items? The Town Code applies equally across the board to <u>all</u> organizations. The only differentiation in the Town Code with regard to non-profit organizations is that there are no fees for the use of Town facilities or equipment for charitable, religious, or civic organizations.
- What is the Town's policy regarding sales on public property, which also includes rights-of-way along the streets? Section 9-1-7 of the Town Code prohibits sales on public property.
- What is the Town's policy regarding sales on private property?
 The Town Code requires written permission from the owner of the property and the property must be properly zoned to allow for retail sales.
- What is the Town policy if I set up sales on my own property and store the merchandise in my garage or shed?
 You must have and display a current Business License and your property must be properly zoned to allow for retail items. If you are storing more than 125 pounds of gunpowder product, you must have a Building Permit and an Operating Permit issued by Camp Verde Fire District.
- Town's policy on selling fireworks out of tents?
 All vendors must comply with zoning codes, fire codes, building codes, etc. before a Certificate of Compliance or a business license certificate may be issued.
- Does the Town have laws prohibiting the use of fireworks within the Town limits?
- Is it illegal to possess fireworks?
 No.
- Is a person responsible for damages that may occur as the result of the use of fireworks within the Town limits?
 Yes, The person(s) creating the damage could be charged with a criminal offense and restitution.
- Whom should I contact if I have a complaint about the use or sale of fireworks?

To Whom It May Concern:

Your letter dated 10-13-10 requested information relative to the sale and use of fireworks in the Town of Camp Verde. As you pointed out in your letter, a new law becomes effective December 1, 2010 that allows the sale of fireworks. Your letter further addresses your intent to use 'non-profit' organizations to sell your merchandise.

Your company and/or your vendors (including not-for-profit organizations/companies) must apply for and have in your possession a Business License prior to any sales. To receive a business license, the business must comply with all applicable Town Codes and Zoning Ordinances. In addition, your company and/or your vendors must also apply for and receive a permit from the Camp Verde Fire District (CVFD), which is a separate governing body from that of the Town. Please be aware that the Clerk's Office cannot issue a business license to sell fireworks without prior approval from the Town's Zoning Official and a valid permit from CVFD.

I have attached a copy of CVFD's regulations and permit process and a flyer that demonstrates those products that are legal for sale in the State of Arizona. Our website at www.campverde.az.gov provides all the information that you will need relative to the business license process, forms, Town Code, zoning ordinances, etc.

To Whom It May Concern:

In May 2010, Gov. Brewer signed HB2246 allowing the sale and use of consumer, safe and sane fireworks in Arizona effective December 1, 2010. The attached letter from the Arizona State Fire Marshal, Robert Barger, provides further details on this law as it pertains to municipalities.

TNT Fireworks is the nation's largest wholesaler of consumer, safe and sane fireworks. Our business model is much like a "franchiser"; we contract with local non-profit organizations who agree to retail our merchandise from temporary venues such as tents on shopping centers. The non-profit organizations sell fireworks to the community as a fundraiser for 1 to 2 weeks during seasons like New Years and July 4th. A large part of TNT's training program for these organizations is educating and assisting them on securing certain permits and licenses.

On behalf of the non-profit organizations retailing our product, we are inquiring as to each city's guidelines with regards to business licenses, Transaction Privilege Tax Licenses and other existing permits relevant to these temporary venues. However, regarding tents, we have entered into arrangements with local professional tent vendors to secure permits for these structures. Additionally, we will need to know the procedures, process times, costs and payment methods.

Throughout Arizona, TNT, is presently contracting with various non-profit organizations, landlords, and tent vendors in preparation for the ensuing selling period of December 2010. We look forward to working closely with each city to ensure these events are mutual successes.

2010 HB2246 Regulation of Fireworks, Chapter 286 Implementation Guidelines for Cities and Towns

Note: Check with your attorney for specific advice about your city or town

Introduction

HB2246 from the Second Regular Session of the 49th Arizona Legislature 2010 authorizes the sale of certain kinds of consumer and display fireworks in the state. It defines these fireworks and authorizes the State Fire Marshal to adopt rules regarding the sale of fireworks and requires retailers to comply with those rules. Fireworks sales are prohibited to persons under the age of 16.

The new law also allows city or town councils to regulate the use of some or all of these fireworks within their corporate limits; counties may regulate them in unincorporated areas. The bill is effective December 1, 2010.

Consumer Fireworks Definition

The kinds of consumer fireworks that can be sold under this law include:

- Ground and hand-held sparkling devices
- Cylindrical fountains
- Cone fountains
- Illuminating torches
- Wheels
- Ground spinners
- Flitter sparklers
- Toy smoke devices
- Wire sparklers or dipped sticks
- Multiple tube fireworks devices and pyrotechnic articles
- Does NOT include:
 - o Anything designed or intended to rise into the air and explode or to fly above the ground, such as:
 - Bottle rockets
 - Sky rockets
 - Missile-type rockets
 - Helicopters

- Torpedoes
- Roman candles
- Jumping jacks

Note: Items <u>not</u> regulated by this law include:

- Toy pistols, canes or guns that use paper caps and paper caps themselves
- Federally deregulated novelty items such as snappers, snap caps, party poppers, glow worms, snakes, toy smoke devices and sparklers

Retail establishments that comply with the State Fire Marshal regulations may sell these kinds of consumer fireworks in Arizona.

Note: Display fireworks, authorized for sale in this law, are federally regulated and are for use only by professionals. Statutes authorizing their local regulation are found in ARS 36-1603 and 36-1604.

Municipal Regulation

A city or town may regulate the use of consumer fireworks within their corporate limits by passing a local ordinance or resolution (sample ordinance attached).

The local regulation cannot prohibit the sale of consumer fireworks within the city or town, but it can prescribe requirements for which items may be lawfully used and when they may be used including:

- Use may be limited only to specific dates or special events such as Fourth of July, New Year's Eve, Super Bowl Sunday, etc.
- Certain hours of the day or night
- Prohibition on use in public parks or other public space
- Prohibition during times of high fire danger
- Complete prohibition on use within the city or town limits

Additional Provisions

The bill permits counties to regulate the use of consumer fireworks during times of wildfire risk. It authorizes the State Fire Marshal to impose a fine of \$1,000 for each incident of prohibited use of fireworks on state land. Fines are to be deposited into the Fire Suppression Revolving Fund established by HB2246.

Sec. 1-6 Liability for emergency responses related to use of fireworks; definitions

(A) A person who uses, discharges or ignites permissible consumer fireworks, fireworks or anything that is designed or intended to rise into the air and explode or to detonate in the air or to fly above the ground, is liable for the expenses of any emergency response that is required by such use, discharge or ignition. The fact that a person is convicted or found responsible for a violation(s) of this article is prima facie evidence of liability under this section.


- (B) The expenses of an emergency response are a charge against the person liable for those expenses pursuant to subpart A of this section. The charge constitutes a debt of that person and may be collected proportionately by the public agencies, for-profit entities or not-for-profit entities that incurred the expenses. The person's liability for the expense of an emergency response shall not exceed [Dollar Amount] for a single incident. The liability imposed under this section is in addition to and not in limitation of any other liability that may be imposed.
 - (C) For the purposes of this section:
 - (1) "Expenses of an emergency response" mean asonable costs directly incurred by public agencies, for-profit entities not-for-profit entities that make an appropriate emergency response to the ident.
 - (2) "Reasonable costs" includes the costs of poviding to ice, fire fighting, rescue and emergency medical services at the cene of an include and the salaries of the persons who respond to the intent.

City of Casa Grande Fireworks Regulation

The use of fireworks is prohibited on public property and the use of permissible consumer fireworks are prohibited except on the following days:

December 31st (New Year's Eve) January 1st (New Years Day) July 4th (Independence Day)

Fireworks authorized for sale under state law shall not be sold to persons less than sixteen years of age.
