On a motion by Bullard, seconded by Hoover, the Board voted unanimously as follows: To approve the request for a blanket variance from the Merchant Group as listed on the document, including Sweet Grace, listed in the Staff Report, to allow continued use of A-Frame signage placed in the Town's right-of-way; the business owners will be required to provide indemnity agreements, proof of additional insurance, and meet all other criteria spelled out in the Town Code Section 118, and Ordinance 2008-A354; this variance is granted only for a period of no more than two (2) years from this date for the participation of this Merchant Group in the text amendment process; this variance will expire either at the end of the two (2) years from this date, or when the amendment process is complete, whichever occurs first.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The decision to approve the application is based on fairness to the merchant community, and to provide a window of opportunity for the merchants to participate in the generation of revised Town Codes and give them some breathing room in the interim; furthermore, the decision to approve is based on the following findings: Special limitations for adequate signage exist along Main Street because of the proximity to the Town right-of-way, the limited exposure to customer traffic for businesses located off Main Street and the lack of participation by the merchants during the amendment process to text amendments that directly affected business.
