The following is the Manager's report regarding activities in the month of November 2016:

Access to Secondary Education

I am part of a committee formed from the Secondary Education Forum and we have begun to meet to discuss improving access to Secondary Education of all forms. In doing so we are looking to get feedback from a variety of age groups to determine the potential barriers that people find when trying to further their education beyond high school. This is a regional group with members from the communities lacking Yavapai College direct access points and intends on developing an action plan to ensure the hurdles that some face are lowered or eliminated in the future to encourage an educated population for our communities' futures.

Part-time Employees and Minimum Wage Changes

Staff began working on adjusting our policies to reflect the changes made in the laws as result of the election. Part-time employees are now eligible for sick leave as of July 2017, this will require a change in our policies. Additionally, we needed to address the costs associated with the increase in the minimum wage, this mostly effects the Pool employees however there are other areas of concern as some making just over that now may have concerns over equity. This issue will continue to be addressed as HR is working on adjustments to the salary plan in the spring in anticipation of a change in the next budget.

Planning & Zoning Monthly Report

Community Development (CD) Director Carmen Howard, and Assistant Planner Kendall Welch, prepared and facilitated the regular session Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. The meeting addressed Zoning text amendments relating to the Wireless Telecommunications Ordinance. P & Z approved the changes and forwarded the amendments to Council for review.

The CD Director met with various departments including Public Works and Economic Development to discuss various potential development projects, potential code amendments and general interdepartmental coordination. Topics included the International Dark Skies designation The Director met with members of the community to discuss potential development proposals, land splits and zoning issues.

The CD Director met with staff and discussed and guided staff with respect to various issues that presented themselves relating to Code violations and development issues. Procedures are being reviewed and staff is being trained to fulfill duties that were performed by staff members that recently vacated their positions. The Department is evolving with all the new staffing which is occurring simultaneously.

Attended Council P&Z meeting with the new Director, Carmen Howard. Met with Economic Development Staff and Community Development Director regarding possible changes to P&Z Lighting Ordinance and possibly seeking accreditation with the International Dark Sky Association. Had a site visit with Public Works Director, Ron Long, Fire Marshal, Kristi Gagnon, Library Director Kathy Hellman and Architect Joel Westervelt regarding an exit issue at the library. Took the new Director on several site visits around Town.

Held a meeting with Building Staff and the owners of the agriculture facility on Hwy 260 regarding the remaining items to be addressed so that a Certificate of Occupancy can be issued. Attended the Quarterly Board of Appeals meeting and presented to them the process and steps in abating Dangerous Structures. Attended a meeting with Community Development staff and the Risk Manager, Carol Brown.

Attended a phone conference with Ron Long, Carmen Howard, Steve Ayers, Mike Dumas and Mr. John Barentine of the International Dark Sky Association, regarding street lighting and Town building lights. Had a pre-construction site visit with the General Contractor at the new Dollar General store in Verde Lakes. Attended the Staff after Council meeting, and attended the Council Retreat with Carmen Howard our new Director.

Had a meeting with Building Staff and economic development specialist Sebra Choe in regard to 'Tiny Houses'. Under current adopted Building Codes a Single Family Residence can be constructed as small as 250 to 300 square feet, depending on design. Discussed the economic viability of development of 'Tiny Houses." Had a second site meeting with Ron Long, Kristi Gagnon, Kathy Hellman, and Joel Westervelt at the Library concerning an exit issue. Also attending was our new Plans Examiner/Building Inspector Elisha New. Her first day was November 21st. Feel free to come by and introduce yourself. Our new Permit Technician, Destiney Jones will start on December 5th.

Had a meeting with Carmen Howard and a local real estate concerning a possible land split, and required Fire Equipment Access. Held a meeting with Building Staff and two agents for the Abide Maternity group regarding a building conversion into a group home for young ladies. It was an honor to invite the community into the new library and to introduce people to this beautiful new facility on November 5th. Though we are still working on a few construction-related items, we are thrilled to finally be operating in our new space and look forward to increasing community participation over the coming years.



Using the new audio visual equipment

installed in the first floor program room to show FREE family movies on Friday nights has proven popular. Three out of 4 nights have drawn 29 people or more.

Friends of Camp Verde Library gave over 268 hours accepting, sorting, arranging, used books to sell at



the Book Nook. Over the first month, sales of used books (average \$.50 ea.) totaled \$1,023. The Friends donated an additional 90+ hours to activities at the Grasshopper basketball concession and to administrative duties.

Report from Circulation and Volunteer
Coordinator, Alice Gottschalk: During our first
week open in November, the library setup a
booth at a Camp Verde Head Start event to issue
library cards. This is the second time we have
participated in this and I sent one of my trusted

volunteers to handle it since it was so soon after our move. We provided a successful outreach

service to people who otherwise may not make it into the library for a library card and encouraged them to use our new facility.

Report from Youth Services Librarian, Nadia Torabi: We are so excited to be in this new building! Wow! So much has changed since our move from the old library to the new library. In the children's room, we have met many new families in the community. Keeping up with the new traffic has been hectic, but it's worth it! I'm excited to see more items get used. We have introduced new children into our programs who are now regulars. We've even had homeschoolers come in more to utilize our space and outreach to other homeschoolers in the community. The same with mothers and their babies and toddlers. They will come in regularly to meet and get to know each other and help their children get the socialization they need that they aren't getting at home. Our space and early learning tools have been a great asset in doing so. I think the most important thing I've noticed this month is how comfortable families in the community feel coming into this bigger space without feeling like they have to rush through due to not wanting to be in the way or from feeling overcrowded. I'm very excited to get to know more families in the community and learn what their needs for their children are that we can help provide or create as far as programs and support.
