A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CAMP VERDE, YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA, URGING OUR CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO AMEND THE MEDICARE PHYSICIANS PAYMENT REFORM ACT


WHEREAS, the United States Congress has enacted the Medicare Physicians Reform Act; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of this Act has created an elimination of services to Medicare patients by physicians who can no longer absorb the cost of providing these services without just reimbursement from the Medicare system; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of these services is magnified in rural areas due to patients' inability to find other physicians.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Camp Verde, Yavapai County, Arizona hereby urges our Congressional Delegation to correct this problem and amend this legislation by making it more feasible for rural health care providers to continue providing their services to Medicare patient.


