MONTHLY REPORT FOR MAY 2015
BUILDING DIVISION

Results of the ISO review and audit were received in May. Town of Camp Verde Building Department rating for Residential Construction went from a 5 to a 3. Commercial Construction rating went from a 5 to a 2. This was a huge improvement in the four (4) years since our last ISO review and audit was made. Building Department is quite proud of this significant achievement, and it will be of considerable value to all the residents of Camp Verde.

Safety Committee conducted the second quarterly Safety Audit on the new Sanitary Building. No significant issues were discovered. A couple of minor Housekeeping items that will be addressed by the Sanitary Department staff.

Attended Council Budget work session May 1st. Also attended the bi-monthly AZBO meeting in Flagstaff with Emily Diver. Held meetings with a Use Permit applicant and a Zoning Change applicant. Met with the owner of a property who is out of compliance with the terms of their Use Permit. Several meetings with the Fire Marshal and property owners. Held a meeting with Kathy Hellman concerning the library project and met with Carol Brown on the Safety Committee agenda for the June meeting.

Completed 100 building inspections, 15 residential plan check reviews, 5 commercial plan check reviews, 126 phone calls, 21 meetings, 13 miscellaneous site inspections, 12 miscellaneous postings, 11 transmittals, 1 business license.

Dianna received the good news that both Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Grants she wrote for the Youth Services Library are being fully funded. Thanks to the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records, a Division of the Secretary of State, Camp Verde Community Library will receive

- \$11,150 for training and programs that provide Resources and Support for Families Facing Autism and
- \$10,275 for Early Literacy Browser Bins Plus – shelving for the new library that promotes interest in and access to reading among our youngest patrons

Camp Verde Community Library has officially joined ASU's Entrepreneurship Outreach Network (EON). This is a collaborative effort between the Library, the Town's Economic Development Department and ASU to support small business, startups, and entrepreneurs to benefit our community. Currently Yavapai College Small Business Development Center holds meetings with clients the first Tuesday of the month at the library as one step toward the library's support of economic development in Camp Verde. Library Director, Kathy Hellman and Volunteer, Ed Lee will attend Facilitator Training in Phoenix in preparation of unveiling CVCL's EON site, The Center, at the our grand opening in 2016. In the last six months Tech Services staff, Valerie Foster and Dee Thompson, have added about 500 new and used DVDs to our collection thanks to a generous donation to Prescott Public Library (PPL) that they shared with other Yavapai Library Network members. Staff at PPL created a list of all the titles and each week, staff at CVCL selected those that they wanted to add to our library. I am proud of our Tech Services staff for taking on this project and making these DVDs available to the public so quickly.

As you can see by our calendar, May was full of activities even while we worked to plan, create and coordinate programs and events for this year's Summer Reading Program. Camp Verde is one of

the few libraries in the state offering programming so adults may participate in the Summer Reading Program. We have many opportunities for people 18 and over to “Escape the Ordinary” this summer through programming and new experiences at the library.

Camp Verde Community Library is thankful for a \$500 donation from Kiwanis Club of Camp Verde. With this generous donation we purchased a [Sphero Education Package](#), which included twelve Sphero Robot balls, ramps, chariots and educational lessons. We will use the lessons provided in the package to teach basic programming, coding and robotics to children participating in our Friday STEAM Time. Our goal for STEAM Time (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) when it begins again in the Fall, is to continue to introduce twenty-first century skills that children need to be successful in today’s world.
