



attended a statewide summit on Volunteerism and Civic Engagement. She returned with ideas and enthusiasm for improving volunteer programs and participation at the library. Alice already does excellent work managing and training the volunteers who help us out at the library so it will be interesting to see what she does to take the library volunteer program to the next level.

Speaking of Volunteers: A couple of young missionary men from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints have joined our ranks. They come in Tuesday afternoons at 1:00p and are available to spend time one-on-one with individuals needing assistance using computers, tablets or other wireless devices. The jurors who will be chosen to hear the first case against a police officer changed in the death of Freddie Gray in Baltimore will be anonymous, at least for now. A judge has ruled that their identities can be shielded from the public. That practice is controversial, but not from the public. That practice is controversial, but not unheard of in high-profile cases. Experts trace the first completely anonymous jury — secret not just to the media, but also to the defendant — to 1977. That's when a judge worried about possible jury tampering by a drug kingpin named Leroy "Nicky" Barnes, a man also known as Mr. Untouchable.

"They tend to be only used in very, very high-profile trials or trials in which there is a serious threat to either

trials or trials in which there is a serious threat to either that safety of the jurors or the integrity of the jury process," said Paula Hannaford-Agor, who studies jury issues at the National Center for State Courts. issues at the National Center for State Courts.

Hannaford-Agor said there are planty of examples in recent years of a more limited approach: keeping juror names from the public and the press during the trial but releasing the information later. She said courts recognize a legitimate need to protect the jury.

There are issues associated with this; this is not necessarily a risk-free civic engagement," she said. By issues, she meant everything from reporters with TV cameras turning up at a juror's door late at night to death threats from neighbors unhappy about the verdict.


