#### **MINUTES**

#### **CAMP VERDE TRAILS AND PATHWAYS COMMISSION** TOWN OF CAMP VERDE COUNCIL CHAMBERS Tuesday, April 8th, 2008

6:30 p.m.

Minutes are a summary of the actions taken. They are not verbatim. Public input is placed after Commission motions to facilitate future research. Public input, where appropriate, is heard prior to the motion.

#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. **Roll Call** 

> Chairperson Haddon, Vice Chairperson Mitton, Members Reddell, Piner, Richmond and Strubhar were present; there is currently one seat vacant.

Also Present: Staff Liaison Lynda Moore, Councilor Ron Smith, U.S.F.S Representative Dee Hines, and Recording Secretary Margaret Harper.

3. **Pledge of Allegiance**

The Pledge was led by Mitton.

On a mbtion by Mitton, seconded by Piner, the Consent Agenda was unanimously approved as presented.

5. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda There was no public input.

6. Update and discussion by Bea Richmond regarding the Dead Horse State Park Trails Coalition followed by possible discussion of the report.

Member Richmond read her written report on the March 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Dead Horse State Park Trails Coalition, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

Chairperson Haddon suggested that Richmond speak about the letter she has drafted to send to the Yavapai-Apache Nation as a member of the Trails Coalition, requesting an opportunity to meet with Chairman Beauty to ask why they were not involved in all the aspects of trails throughout the County, and would they like to be involved. Richmond asked whether the Commission wanted her to bring up the issue of Jackson Flat; Haddon said that she would be acting as a citizen involved in many groups, and did not want the appearance that she would be acting on behalf of the Commission. Richmond said she would be asking whether Chairman Beauty thinks she should go before their Tribal Council, because she thinks that they may have something of the same image or vision that Camp Verde does. Haddon said he would talk privately with her about that, and perhaps makes it an agenda item for another meeting.

Reddell pointed out that the Commission had previously agreed to discuss the issue with Judy Adams and Mr. Stafford first; Haddon suggested that further discussion would be more appropriate under Item 11. Richmond said the issue could be put on the agenda for her to report on it at the May meeting.

## 7. Update and discussion by Bill Mitton regarding the proposed Ryal Canyon Trailhead.

Mitton reported that he had met with Blair Jenner today; Mitton told Jenner that he would probably be seeing Dee Hines tonight. Jenner asked Mitton to have Hines call him; he is waiting to hear from Hines.

**Dee Hines** commented from the audience that he had talked with Mr. Jenner and had explained that the land exchange process can be cumbersome, especially for a small single exchange, adding that it would work better to combine it in a large exchange that may be developing. There was some further discussion between Councilor Smith and Hines on the issue of applying for an OHV grant, with Hines commenting that it is worth looking into.

Smith came to the podium and summarized the conversation with Dee Hines regarding the possibility of applying for a grant next year to acquire or develop the Ryal Canyon Trailhead; the original trail was constructed with OHV money. The Commission could get the ball rolling on that grant; the grant cycle is February '09. Smith explained that every OHV contributes money to a fund; the fund is pooled for the creation of trailheads and other improvements, including more OHV trails, and any unused money goes back into the General Fund. That would be another avenue to explore if the land trade did not work. Smith said that grants may be a good way to go, that he and Reddell have been working on the Copper Canyon Trail for a number of years and hopefully it will get done this year. Hines agreed that the idea has a lot of merit and is worth looking into A land exchange will not be executed inside of a year, and that needs to get underway before taking on another project.

Mitton told **Hines** to not he sitate to call Blair Jenner: he has lots of money and is not holding his breath, but would like to see the trade happen. **Hines** said he has provided the information to a group that is interested in putting together an exchange; Mr. Jenner had indicated that would be fine.

8. Update and discussion by staff of the Copper Canyon Trailhead Project.
Discussion may include, but not be limited to letters from the Marshal's
Office, Fire Department and the Streets Department regarding servicing the
area, staff meeting with Dee Hines, U.S.F.S. and the progress of the project.
More advised the Chairperson that this agenda item should have been revised
somewhat since it was discussed last month and instead should have indicated an
update and report from the liaison group on where they stand. Haddon said that the
item was written broadly enough that the discussion can be held.

Reddell gave an update on the project as well as the concern of the Forest Service for a liaison to work between the Town and the Forest Service on the in-kind donations. Moore confirmed the status of the paving and construction of the road. Reddell outlined the liaison group to work on the in-kind donations headed by Councilor Smith with Reddell and Mitton. Reddell suggested that Mr. Hines give an update on the project.

**Dee Hines** explained the importance of having the Town named as the liaison between the Forest Service and the Town; that would allow one agreement to be entered into with the Town of Camp Verde instead of with each individual or entity volunteering a donation. Mr. Hines commented that determining the location of the trailhead was influenced by the issue of vandalism.

The Commission then discussed with Mr. Hines at length the subject of how to discourage vandalism, his suggestion to train a group to patrol an area on a regular basis, and questioned whether it is necessary to include restrooms. There were mixed

opinions regarding whether the restrooms were necessary. There was also discussion on installing cameras to help prevent vandalism, as suggested by Councilor Smith. Smith briefly discussed with Hines the status of the in-kind donations. A meeting is scheduled for Monday, April  $14^{th}$  in the Marshal's conference room with the U.S.F.S and the three individuals working on the in-kind donations. Mr. Hines advised the Commission if things were done other than what is in the grant; that will have to be bounced back off of the State.

9. Update and Discussion by staff regarding a meeting date with Bill Stafford and Judy Adams of the U.S.F.S. Item may include but not be limited to the dates, time's locations and update of the General Crook Trail projects.

Moore reported that she did speak with Bill Stafford; they are not ready to come before the Trails & Pathways Commission because of the pressure of work and not having had time to review the paperwork that Reddell had submitted.

Chairperson Haddon said that he hoped they were not putting off a meeting for the purpose of letting time pass to where the Town no longer was able to file a protest. Moore explained that Mr. Stafford has said they will call when they are ready. Maddon confirmed that the meeting was about the Jackson Flat issue. Moore was requested to continue to call them at least once a month.

10. Discussion of Jackson Flat and the General Crook Trail that Bill Stafford had discussed at the February 12, 2008 meeting.

The discussion continued with the question of whether to contact the Forest Service since they are the de facto owners of the property, or go to the Yavapai-Apache Nation. There was the comment that both fronts need to be pursued, or the Commission would be remiss in its duties.

Chairperson Haddon suggested that the agenda items are not being written broad enough to allow for some discussions; every time he tries to write an agenda item somebody tries to narrow it down, and the Commission should be able to discuss all aspects of how to pursue obtaining rights to go across the Jackson Flats. After further discussion it was pointed out that Mr. Stafford had referred to the Jackson Flat issue at the February  $12^{th}$  meeting. Haddon reiterated that it is incumbent upon the Commission to pursue both fronts; if a pleasant meeting can be had with the Y-A Nation and everything wanted can be accomplished, then we should endorse whatever their efforts are.

Moore suggested that the issue be brought to the Town Manager who has been meeting with Chairman Beauty; it may be something they can discuss informally, and perhaps get a feel as to what is happening in the Jackson Flat area. The members discussed the plan for Richmond to meet with Chairman Beauty, and suggested that it might be appropriate to discuss the issue if it is brought up, and whatever Richmond could come back and report would be fine. There was also some speculation on what plans the Nation had for the Jackson Flat area if they were to acquire it.

Councilor Smith cautioned that it would be wrong to approach the Nation for anything other than cooperation; also, the previous Chairman and his Council were very amenable to integration of trail systems as long as the Tribe is included. Every effort should be made to earn back the trust of the Nation that was lost years ago.

**11. Discussion and update of the Verde Valley Regional Trails Plan.** Member Richmond reported on the March 27, 2008 Regional Trails meeting; a copy of her written report is attached as Exhibit 2.

The next Regional Trails Planning meeting will be held April 24<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, tentatively in the Parks & Recreation Conference Room.

## 12. Discussion, consideration and possible direction to Council asking to expand the Commission's mandate to include motorized transportation on trails.

Chairperson Haddon said that he and Piner attended the State Trails Conference and were impressed with the motorized component of that Conference which led to the feeling that it is necessary to address motorized use of any trails being considered, either for or against. Piner added that the Commission is working on a Trails Policy; it is directed by the Town's General Plan that indicates that non-motorized vehicles are being looked at. Moore reported that she had not had time to research trails policies of other communities as had been requested. Moore said she would follow up and e-mail to the members any responses prior to the May 13<sup>th</sup> Work Session.

**Councilor Smith** pointed out that many trails were put in the General Plan as multiuse. He recommended that the Commission prepare the Trails Policy that will then have to be approved by the Council at which time a statement can be made regarding expanding the mandate to include motorized transportation. Smith described how trails are designated in Montana.

**Dee Hines** said that when it comes to trails, integrated planning is something that the Forest Service supports.

#### 13. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda.

**Dee Hines** reported on the Forest Service building plans for their new office. There are plans to station one personnel at the Chamber of Commerce office one day a week for the purpose of providing visitor information services.

Ron Smith commented on the "green" building being planned by the Forest Service. He antidipates a wonderful relationship between the Forest Service and the new Town Park.

There was no further public Input.

#### 14. Commission Informational Reports

**Reddell** said she understands the Coconino Forest item will be returned to the agenda each month. Also, add an item on the agenda for discussion, consideration and possible direction on Bea's pathway from the stop sign down.

**Piner** asked about the two items she had requested: the trail along the river from the EnviroZeum, and the field trip on the trails.

**Haddon** invited everyone to his business, Beaver Creek Books, Music Night next Saturday, 7:00 p.m.

#### 15. Staff Report and discussion.


Moore reported that a file cabinet will be available in the very near future. The field trip will be delayed until the full Commission is in place; an agenda item will be included for setting a date.

#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:30 p.m.

#### 2. Roll Call

Chairperson Bach, Vice Chairperson Buchanan, Commissioners McReynolds, Varela, Roddan and Davis were present; Commissioner Freeman was absent.

Also Present: Housing Department Director Matt Morris and Administrative Assistant Teresa Goodwin.

#### 3. Pledge of Allegiance

The pledge was not conducted as there is no flag in the conference room.

4. Housing Commission discussion, consideration, and preparation for upcoming Town Council and Housing Commission Joint Work Session scheduled for April 9, 2008.

Director Matt Morris opened the discussion by raising the question of how the Commission would like to approach the joint work session scheduled with the Town Council on April 9<sup>th</sup>, and who would lead the discussion with Council. Chairman Bach suggested Vice Chairperson Buchanan would be the best choice, as she would be able to answer most questions from the Council.

Buchanan agreed to lead the discussion, but feels all Commission members are well-informed and various questions by Council could be handled by the Commission member with the most knowledge on a given topic. She would like to review the whole public process to date, and convey to the Council that this group effort by the Housing Commission is now ready to turn over to the Council for their consideration.

Bach asked how much information the Council already has. Morris explained he and Town Manager Scannell have met with all of the Council members during the last two weeks to apprise them of issues surrounding the property, community lands trusts, and possible ways to proceed with the property. He feels the Council has a basic understanding and the Commission should have a productive meeting in moving forward with this opportunity to promote attainable housing within the community.

The members discussed whether to use the PowerPoint presentation prepared by the Housing Department. It was decided it would be better to use printed handouts including: a letter from a local teacher which illustrates the need for affordable housing in the community, the public process which has been implemented to date, and the timeline of the next steps in the development process including an estimated six months to complete the Request For Proposals (RFP).

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The members questioned the timeline as presented, and wondered if it could be finished sooner. There was more detailed discussion by Morris of the various steps in the process, and the estimated time of completion. There was discussion of the PAD process, and whether it will be completed by the Town or by potential developers.

Bach brought up potential financing scenarios. He feels the Town has a competitive edge as a developer because bonds could be used as a source of financing. He explained how this might allow the library to obtain funds earlier in the process than relying solely on private financing.

There was discussion of the Drachman Report and whether developers should be required to follow its suggestions. Bach indicated the value of the report to a developer, as it would save a lot of money in the planning process. Commissioner Varela said the Commission should sell the plan to Council, as it is a good plan, but the location may or may not be feasible for affordable housing. Commissioner Roddan thought it would be good to allow developers some flexibility in utilizing the Drachman materials. Commissioners Davis and McReynolds agreed. Buchanan emphasized the importance of the development complementing the surrounding neighborhood, rather than the development standing out as the affordable housing project. She further emphasized the great value of the document, and suggested the Commission recommend it be used as far as possible by developers.

It was decided the Commission will present general information and goals to the Council as outlined in the handouts, as well as a recommendation the RFP should ask potential developers to utilize the Drachman plan, but make changes as necessary to make the project viable. Buchanan will lead the discussion with Council. Roddan will answer questions regarding non-profits and personal financing. Because of his experience with Community Land Trusts in Flagstaff, Bach will field questions regarding this and bond financing, as well as housing inventory and how the timing of development could be advantageous to the town and the funding of the library.

Buchanan said the main goals to emphasize should be to manage community assets wisely, build a quality project, generate attainable housing opportunities, and ensure viability.

# MINUTES REGULAR SESSION HOUSING COMMISSION TOWN OF CAMP VERDE COUNCIL CHAMBERS TUESDAY, April 15, 2008 4:00 P.M.

Public input is placed after Commission motions to facilitate future research.

Public input, where appropriate, is heard prior to the motion.

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

Roll Call

Chairperson Bach, Vice Chairperson Buchanan, Commissioners McReynolds, Varela, Roddan and Freeman were present; Commissioner Davis was absent.

**Also Present:** Housing Department Director Matt/Morris and Recording Secretary Margaret Harper.

3. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge was led by McReynolds.

- 4. Consent Agenda All those items listed below may be enacted upon by one motion and approved as consent agenda items. Any item may be removed from the Consent Agenda and considered as a separate item if a member of Council requests.

On a motion by Bach, seconded by Varela, the Consent Agenda was unanimously approved as presented.

5. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda.

There was no public input.

6. Presentation by Jer Cox, Co-Owner of Mountain Country Mortgage, regarding housing development finance methods and options, followed by Housing Commission discussion and review. (Item requested by Chairman Bach.)

The presentation by **Jer Cox**, co-owner of Mountain Country Mortgage, reviewed the role of his company in helping people to understand the different approaches to buying a home, and outlined extensive details of the financing options of government loans, and especially the benefits of the Rurál Housing Program for buyers with limited incomes. The presentation was followed by a Commission discussion with Mr. Cox addressing the issues of rehab programs, creative financing and the need for affordable housing.

7. Discussion, consideration and planning of strategy and future steps to proceed with the Parkway Homes development on the Town owned 5-acre property located on Cliffs Parkway. (Commission discussion may include: drafting of Request For Proposals, property appraisal, establishment of long term affordability criteria including ground lease and resale formulas, homebuyer outreach, drafting of development agreement, establishment of a PAD district and subdivision plat, homebuyer qualifying and selection, and the establishment and ongoing management of a Community Land Trust program.)

Staff was directed to identify the meeting times for the various Commissions; determine who can attend those meetings; send out to the members the key points

## that were talked about last week for the Commission to review and think about at the next meeting.

Housing Director Morris introduced the subject discussion commenting that the Commission has come a long way, and after having been giving the green light by the Town Council it is now time to move forward. Morris said that at the meeting last week the basic timeline laid out was to have an appraisal done on the property in November with the goal of having the RFP done by December, and released in January. The members discussed inviting input from other Town Commissions, as well as including HOA's. Morris said he would send the May meeting schedule of the other Commissions to each member; decisions can be made regarding who would contact which Commission to set up an agenda item for a brief presentation by a member from the Housing Commission to invite liaison representation at the Housing Commission meetings. Morris said he had already made the department heads aware of that idea.

The Commission acknowledged the challenge of developing an REP in connection with the 5-acre parcel; copies of sample RFP's had been included in the agenda packets for reference. It was also pointed out that the RFP would appear to require the greatest amount of time in comparison with the other steps that are involved in the proposed Parkway Homes development, and it was suggested that those steps be addressed in order of priorities. The issue of preparing the RFP with enough flexibility for the developer to trust that he would be able to put the 30 units on the parcel was also addressed. The members discussed with Morris ways in which they might help with work on the RFP such as individual research and assistance in developing the verbiage. Morris suggested that the Commission should focus on what the goals are, what do the members want to see in the document as far as importance, perhaps hold more Work Sessions, and focus on the five acres for the next six months or more. It was generally agreed that getting the cooperation of the other Commissions is important to help with the goals of the Housing Commission. It was suggested that staff send out to the members the key points to share with the other Commissions, with the members to have those points foremost in their minds to start clarifying what is wanted in the RFP, and come back to the next meeting prepared to prioritize and schedule work on those further. As for the property appraisal, Bach estimated that it would cost approximately \$7500.

There was no public input.

8. Discussion, consideration and review of Camp Verde Uptown Redevelopment Program, June 2006 Draft, document followed by Commission discussion on possible next steps in advancing the document.

Freeman outlined the history of developing two documents, one the historic document and the other the document prepared by the consultant in connection with the proposed redevelopment program. The Commission discussed their confusion over the documents, with a suggestion to go back into the archives and research their origins. It was suggested that the Commission should take the subject document as it exists, update it with new data, confirm that the document's priorities are in line with the current priorities, and then pass it to the Council to develop the Town policy as far as the Redevelopment Program. It was agreed to try to find the other document, and to put it on the next Agenda for review and discussion.

Morris said that although the five acres would take precedence right now, staff will research with the Town Clerk, try to find the report that was done by the consultant, and go from there. Freeman said that because he had past experience with the subject Town document, he would volunteer to spend more of his time with the document, with the other members focusing on the five-acre parcel.

9. Discussion, consideration and possible recommendation to Council regarding authorizing the pursuit of attainable housing legislative strategies and to support continued funding of the State Housing Trust Fund.

Staff was directed to draft a memo to Council to let it know where the Housing Commission stands on the subject legislation, that they are looking at those items further.

Morris reported information that at the Verde Valley Housing Task Force meeting, the City of Sedona had given permission to their Housing Commission to push for plan of action on different legislative items, one being inclusionary zoning and another being consistency in appraisals, which he suggested might be of interest in the five-acre property. Morris said this item was on the Agenda to discuss whether the Commission would be interested in supporting the proposed legislation. The members suggested that what works for one community may not work for another; Sedona is at a different stage in political issues, and at this time the legislation does not appear to be in the best interest of Camp Verde.

#### 10. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda.

There was no public input.

#### 11. Commission Informational Reports:

McReynolds reported on his tour of the Tribe's housing, that it was very impressive.

Roddan agreed with what McReynolds had to say, and suggested sending a Thank-You note to the Nation.

Varela acknowledged that it is now up to the members to continue the work Morris has started.

Freeman reminded the others about the Verde Valley Water Users meeting in Cornville this Thursday at 7:00 p.m.; Chip Davis will speak on current litigation.

Buchanan said that Yavapai College held its public forum in Camp Verde on March 25<sup>th</sup>; housing is a critical issue for any employer. Buchanan suggested an Agenda item for May to discuss a quarterly tour of other neighborhoods, for instance, Verde Lakes, to become better acquainted with the community at the grass roots level:

Bach thanked everyone for their work on the Commission; he is proud to be a part of the group.

#### 12. Staff Report

Morris said that the Housing Commission is being held up as a prime example of a Commission by comparison with others, everyone is doing a great job. Morris reported that the Regional Planning group is holding the first-ever Verde Valley Regional Plan Symposium on April 29<sup>th</sup>. He was invited to give a talk on what Camp Verde is doing; he will not be available, but anyone interested in attending should let Morris know. Morris also gave an update on the Home grant activities.

# Housing & Neighborhood Revitalization Department Monthly Report – May 2008

#### Revolving Loan Fund (RLF)

The Town's Housing Rehabilitation Program has currently four open loans from previous renovations. The fund continues to grow with monthly payments and interest earned in the savings account. The annual percentage yield earned in March in the savings account was 1.43%; the interest payment for March was \$229.64. The monthly payments in April raised the account balance by \$1184.13 for a grand total of \$193,237.26. The current balance owed by the program participants is \$200,242.26.

#### **CV Owner Occupied Home Rehabilitation Program**

Of the five applicants who completed documentation of their applications in March, two have withdrawn their applications for personal reasons. In April, we qualified an additional four applications. With our original pre-qualified applicant we now have eight candidates for rehabilitation loans. Site visits to all eight properties have been made by Matt Morris, Building Official Rick Feldmann, and Building Inspector Robert Foreman. We will prepare and submit project reports to the Loan Committee for all eight qualified applicants before mid-June.

While the initial intent with the HOME grant was to serve four homes, we have recently learned from the Arizona Department of Housing we are required to consume all of the funds in the RLF prior to expending the HOME grant funds. The payments we receive into the RLF are from a previous CDBG grant and are considered, including the interest earned, to be "Program Income" (PI) and are required to be spent only on housing items prior to receiving additional grant funding. Because of the need to utilize the money in the RLF, we will now be able to serve additional home owners. However, this will obviously increase the amount of work to be completed by the December 31, 2008 deadline.

#### **Town Owned 5-Acre Site**

On April 8<sup>th</sup>, the Housing Commission held a work session to prepare for the joint session with the Town Council on the 9<sup>th</sup>. They discussed issues surrounding the property, community land trusts, and possible ways to proceed with the property.

At the joint work session on April 9<sup>th</sup>, it was suggested that the Housing Commission contact the other Commissions to ask for a liaison from each to attend Housing Commission meetings and provide feedback in future planning regarding the property. In May, we will attend the various Commissions meetings to present the Parkway Homes housing strategy and solicit their input.

The Housing Commission and Staff were directed to proceed with work on drafting a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the five-acre parcel, and for establishing long term attainable housing criteria for the Parkway Homes development. The timeline for this future task was discussed, with an estimate of late 2008 or early 2009 for this to be accomplished.

#### **Verde Valley Housing Taskforce (VVHT)**

On April 29<sup>th</sup>, in conjunction with the VVHT, Housing Commission Chairman Jeremy Bach gave a presentation at the first ever Verde Valley Regional Plan Symposium. The presentation included an outline of the public outreach and planning process for the Cliffs Parkway property, the proposed Parkway Homes development as envisioned by the Drachman Institute, and Camp Verde's goals for future development of the property. This was an opportunity for Camp Verde to "lead by example" and promote attainable housing strategies to the region.

The VVHT will present their efforts at the next Verde Valley Intergovernmental meeting on May 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### Camp Verde Housing Strategy & Summer Internship

With the Council approval of the Housing Department summer internship position, we will begin to update the document with current data. The document is almost ten years old, and uses census data from 1990. We have created a digital copy of the 1999 Housing Strategy document which our future Intern, Ms. Liyu Wang from Arizona State University, will be able to use as a template for an updated version. The internship will provide a valuable opportunity for Ms. Wang to learn about housing issues and to experience a western small town culture far from her home in China. We are currently coordinating logistics, and are planning for Ms. Wang to start on June 9<sup>th</sup>.

## **Camp Verde Safety Committee**

On May 1, Ed Bantel Program Administrator of Southwest Risk/Arizona Municipal Risk Retention Pool, gave a presentation to members of the Safety Committee and Department Heads on AMRRP history, programs, and Town coverage and services. He explained the various types of coverage the Town has, as well as inviting questions regarding specific situations within the Town. Among items discussed were various liability issues such as serving of alcohol at special events, issues surrounding the Skateboard Park, and how waivers, indemnification agreements, and certificates of insurance should be used. Mr. Bantel will present again on June 11<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

#### **Statistical Report**

## Physical Changes to the Current Library / New Library Developments

There were no major problems with the building this month.

The Town council has directed staff to start looking for money for the building project. I don't expect anything to happen with this direction until we finish the budget process for fiscal 2008 – 2009.

#### **Books Videos, Computer Updates**

In April we added 297 items to the collection including 5 audio books. The new book list is now available on our website at <a href="https://www.cvaz.org/library">www.cvaz.org/library</a> Click on the "New Books List" link on our home page. We still have paper copies available here at the library.

Some of our patrons have had trouble accessing Rosetta Stone, which we get through the State Library. I have the network Systems Administrator working on the problem. We have also become aware of a problem MAC users may have accessing our catalog. Please let us know about any of these problems & we will help people get connected.

#### **Programs & Activities**

In March, we hosted 3 adult programs, 7 children's programs, 1 program for all ages, 4 programs for teens and 4 school visits. We had a total of 111 adults 41 teens and 228 children at our programs. We had about 23.5 volunteer hours donated in this department last month.

#### **Funding & Fund Raising**

The Library Endowment Group made about \$13,000 from the Denim & Lace Dinner / Auction held on April 5<sup>th</sup> 5:00 to 10:00 PM at the Lodge at Cliff Castle.

I have submitted the library's 2008 / 2009 budget. We would like to add more hours of service and start a database or information bank about various services available to our patrons. At this point in time, these proposals are still alive.

The Basha's "Thanks A Million Program" is finished for another year. According to the Basha's website, the Endowment should get about \$800 from the program this year. The number is 23066. Please link it to your "Thank You" card and the Endowment gets a percentage of your shopping dollars. I will let you know when the program starts again.

I am also encouraging people to sign up for the e-Scrip program (number 152446398). If anyone has any questions, they may contact the library. You can also get more information on the Internet at http://www.escrip.com/ The eScrip program is nation wide and ongoing. The closest participants are Safeway Grocery Store, Office Max, and Servicemaster Clean in Cottonwood and New Frontiers Market in Sedona. The Town is now going through some tough financial times. I believe we can get through it without cutting anything.

#### **Publicity**

In March, publicity was still about our programming. The 10-week program for teens about music finished up and we are letting the group prepare for their CD production in a few weeks.

We got the word out about our next book sale on May 1<sup>st</sup>. We also wanted to inform the public that this would be a monthly occurrence.

Publicity for National Library Week went well and the week was very successful. The Library Endowment held their 8<sup>th</sup> annual Denim & Lace Diner / Auction and it to was a great success.

#### **Meetings Attended**

Met with Barbara Kile and Bob Kuker on April 17 to talk about the future of the Beaver Creek Branch Library. Rent will be charged and we will be going to the Beaver Creek residents to raise money to support this.

Met with the county public library managers on April 9<sup>th</sup> to discuss a proposed formula that the county would use to distribute the county library tax. What we saw looked good and we made some suggested changes. I am looking forward to the next draft.

On April 10<sup>th</sup>, Jan Alice & I attended a demonstration of the new Symphony integrated library system from Sirsi Dynix. Everyone liked what they saw and wonder if the company could deliver.

On April 11<sup>th</sup>, the network management committee met to discuss the previous days event and a proposed formula to determine what we all pay into the network

#### **Miscellaneous Items**

We are drafting a lease agreement with the new owner if the building that houses our Beaver Creek Branch.

We are in the process of acquiring a postage meter to put postage on our outgoing mail.
