1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. Roll Call

Chairperson Mina, Vice Chairperson Heuman, Commissioners Nielson, and Sykes were present; Doering arrived at 6:31 p.m.; Commissioners Pastine and Chatley were absent.

Also Present:

Library Director Gerard Laurito, and Recording Secretary Margaret Harper.

3. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge was led by Mina.

On a motion by Sykes, seconded by Mina, the Consent Agenda was unanimously approved as presented.

5. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda

Amber Polo announced that the Editor of The Bugle has asked her to write a blog on the newspaper website about the Library, and she will be looking for guest bloggers; details are being worked out.

6. Discussion and possible recommendation to council regarding the Quarterly report for the 2nd quarter of 2008

On a motion by Heuman, seconded by Doering, the Commission voted unanimously to recommend Council approval of the Quarterly Report for the 2nd quarter of 2008.

Chairperson Mina presented the Quarterly Report she had prepared for review by the members; after a brief discussion it was agreed that the document correctly reported the activities of the Commission during the subject quarter.

7. Discussion and possible recommendation to council regarding a fundraising golf tournament.

Director Laurito was directed to follow through with getting the final approval from the Council as soon as possible for the golf tournament.

Director Laurito commented that the formal recommendation to Council had been made at the May meeting; he has not yet presented the recommendation to Council for approval to proceed with arranging the golf tournament..

Commissioner Sykes reported that he has been working out the details with the Golf Pro at the B.C. Ranch Golf Course, and is ready to proceed with the final arrangements. Sykes added that Amber Polo has volunteered to help with getting donations from various people to be used as prizes during the tournament.

PUBLIC INPUT

Linda Harkness, from the Citizens Committee for the Camp Verde Library, said that her group had proposed handling the details of the proposed tournament, and the proceeds would then go directly toward the Library funds being collected by CCCVL for construction.

After further Commission discussion, it was decided that Director Laurito would obtain Council approval at the earliest opportunity, after which the Commission would request that CCCVL then spearhead the golf tournament, including the financial arrangements as proposed by Ms. Harkness, as well as the publicity and soliciting prizes.

8. Discussion and possible recommendation to council regarding Major Donors to the new library

Commissioner Nielson said that he and Commissioner Pastine have made considerable progress in contacting potential donors, including Steve Coury who is interested in being a participant; there are three potential major donors at this point in time. Nielson and Pastine will report further details at the July meeting.

The members discussed possible ways to recognize major donors, including adding permanent plaques at the new Library. Laurito also described a possible way to receive funding based on a commitment from local merchants to donate to the Library a certain percentage of their business proceeds on a particular day. It was suggested that Nielson and Pastine coordinate efforts to follow through with approaching the local businesses, including enlisting help from CCCV, and report back to the Commission on possible arrangements for a proposed "Library Day."

9. Discussion and possible recommendation to council on advertising for fundraising for the new library building. The discussion will include the financing of the advertising. It was determined that no recommendation to Council regarding advertising funding at this time. Doering suggested that creating public service announcements would be one way to advertise at no cost, and described how such announcements in front of a camera could be produced at very little expense.

11. Report on and discussion of the latest activities of the Concerned Citizens for Camp Verde Library (CCCVL)

Linda Harkness reported on getting the signs placed and covered by the local newspapers, and the sales of the bottled water, both at Basha's and on Saturdays at the Farmers Market. Among activities being planned are a Rummage Sale, possibly in September, and perhaps a monthly fund-raising dinner at Simply Gary's. The total funds currently held by CCCVL amount to approximately \$8,000. Also, at the Corn Festival on July 19th, Director Laurito has committed to having his head shaved if a certain amount of money is donated, for example, \$5,000.

12. Discussion and possible recommendation to council regarding the 2008 /2009 library budget

Director Laurito reviewed and discussed with the members the amounts set forth on the proposed Library Budget, including several revisions that had been made at the last Budget meeting. There was no action taken; the Town budget will be going to Council shortly for final approval.

13. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda

There was no public input.

14. Discussion and consideration of the Director/Staff Report.

In addition to his written report, copies of which were provided in the agenda packets, Laurito reported on the successful Teen Music Program. The teens have produced a CD and are working on a video. Those can be purchased at the Library, with a portion of the funds to be earmarked for the Library. Laurito described other programs being planned. Laurito also gave an update on the Rosetta Stone system.

15. Commission Comments, Informational Reports, Activity Updates, and Agenda Item Requests:

There were no Commission Informational Reports. Chairperson Mina requested an agenda item for a follow-up on the proposed Library Day along with the Major Donors issue, the work being done by Liaisons Nielson and Pastine on fundraising, and perhaps a discussion on the proposal for plaques to recognize donors.

Laurito advised the members that the questions raised to present to the Town Attorney have now been addressed and answers provided to the Council and the Town Manager; it is now a dead issue.

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:15 p.m.

2. Roll Call

Commissioners McReynolds, Varela, Roddan and Freeman were present; Commissioner Davis, Chairperson Bach, and Vice Chairperson Buchanan were absent.

Also Present: Housing Department Director Matt Morris and Administrative Assistant Teresa Goodwin.

3. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge was led by Morris

4. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda
There was no public input.

5. Housing Commission discussion, consideration, and possible recommendation to Town Council regarding support of League of Arizona Cities & Towns Resolution to urge the State Legislature to enact enabling legislation that would allow local control for each community in Arizona to determine for itself whether or not to require developers to include some affordable housing in new development or redevelopment projects. This resolution was submitted to the league by the City of Sedona.

Director Matt Morris opened the discussion by reviewing the Resolution, which has been discussed at a previous Housing Commission meeting, and commenting that although it is the choice of each City or Town to support the measure or not, the City of Sedona is asking for the support of local communities. If the Housing Commission decides to support the Resolution, they will make a recommendation to the Town Council to support at the State level. Morris feels it would not hurt to support the measure, even if the Town decides not to enact such legislation locally, since the Resolution is simply to allow each community to make its own choice regarding inclusionary zoning.

There was some discussion by Commissioners as to why such legislation is necessary, since a town could enact an inclusionary zoning measure now. Morris explained that while it may be possible for a community to develop an Inclusionary Zoning Ordinance by conducting a Nexus Study, such a study could prove quite expensive and time-consuming, while the passage of the resolution would preserve the community's right to implement such an ordinance. The concern stems from the fact the Arizona legislature has passed "anti-Inclusionary Zoning" legislation in the past which was vetoed by Governor Napolitano.

There was discussion by the Commissioners regarding the fact that Sedona has very different housing issues than Camp Verde. Roddan stated that requiring developers to include affordable housing in their projects is not necessarily appropriate for Camp Verde. Freeman agreed that

Sedona has different issues but helping Sedona by showing support of this resolution could be beneficial to the working relationship of the two municipalities.

Morris pointed out again that supporting the resolution does not necessarily imply that Camp Verde intends to enact inclusionary zoning requirements, only that it would have the right if it was later decided to be in the best interests of the Town.

Roddan expressed some concern that the language of the resolution is not clear enough. Freeman commented that the resolution could keep the Town's options open.

Tony Varela made a motion to not support the resolution, the motion was seconded by John McReynolds.

There was then further discussion of whether to amend the language of the motion. Since the motion was already seconded, it was decided to make a second motion to amend the language of the first motion.

A second motion was made by Freeman to broaden and clarify the language of the first motion. Second motion was seconded by Varela. Three voted in favor, one against. The motion failed due to lack of a quorum.

The Commission then voted on the original motion: To not support item #6. A vote was taken, three in favor, one against. The motion failed due to a lack of a quorum.

After further discussion of the issues, Freeman made a motion to recommend support to the Town Council with indications of concern of various aspects of the resolutions, and recognizing that the Town may or may not find it in Camp Verde's best interest to adopt inclusionary zoning requirements for local development.

A vote was taken, the motion passed unanimously.

6. Discussion, consideration and possible recommendation to Town Council regarding support of League of Arizona Cities and Towns Resolution to urge the State Legislature to adopt legislation establishing a uniform property tax assessment methodology for deed-restricted housing created under an affordable housing program that recognizes the limited profits owners of deed-restricted housing can realize.

Morris opened the discussion by explaining the purpose of the proposed legislation. That low-income property owners could not afford property tax increases on the full value of their property.

After some discussion of possible methodology to enact such assessment, the motion was made by Sharon Roddan to support the resolution with the caveat that the tax methodology should be based on original acquisition cost, such as California's proposition 13.

Varela seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

7. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 5:45 p.m.

6. Introduction of Housing & Neighborhood Revitalization Department Summer Intern, Ms. Liyu Wang.

Director Morris introduced Liyu Wang, whose internship in the Housing Department commenced last week. Ms. Wang reviewed her background in environmental engineering in Shanghai, and her subsequent interest in the many issues found in planning, including social justice and housing. During her presentation, Ms. Wang outlined how the Chinese government retains ownership of land, granting only the use of the property for construction of homes, and described the wide gap between the wealthy and the poor.

Following the presentation, Morris reviewed the project Ms. Wang is currently working on; the members welcomed Ms. Wang, and expressed appreciation for the interesting information she had shared.

7. Presentation by BSB Design of their conceptual plan for the Parkway Homes development on the Town owned 5-acre property located on Cliffs Parkway, followed by discussion and consideration by Housing Commission.

Director Morris distributed copies of the subject conceptual site plan for reference during the presentation. Morris explained that BSB Design had learned about the proposed Parkway Homes project and expressed interest in doing some pro bono work, looking at the 5-acre site, and coming up with an alternate conceptual plan.

Dana Burkhardt, on behalf of BSB Design, outlined the background of his company, and explained that the conceptual site plan represents an alternative design to the Drachman Institute plan to aid in the feasibility study for developing the site. Mr. Burkhardt gave a detailed Power Point presentation to illustrate their work specializing in the planning and design of cost effective housing in all price ranges and styles. The Commissioners reviewed and discussed with Mr. Burkhardt in detail the conceptual plan his company had developed. At the conclusion of the presentation, Morris reminded the members that this is the third entity from which input has been sought, and thanked Mr. Burkhardt for coming up from the Valley to speak to the Commission.

8. Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda.

There was no public input.

9. **Commission Informational Reports:**

McReynolds commented on his participation on the Loan Committee, going through their first set of applications.

Davis also spoke about the Loan Committee review of applications, adding that there appears to be a lot of need out there.

Varela agreed on the great amount of time spent on the applications, and said he felt that he helped to some degree.

Buchanan reported on her attendance at the Camp Verde Unified School District Public Forum on Facilities Development on June 3rd; the planning being done is fascinating, and she encouraged everyone to participate since an understanding of what the School District is going to do with their development efforts could enhance the work being done by the Commission. Buchanan suggested setting a **future agenda item** to invite the School Superintendent, or representative, to share an outline of their proposed development plans with the Commission.

Bach apologized for not yet having the Quarterly Reports done; he agreed that it would be helpful to be aware of what the School District is doing, and also encouraged participation.

10. Staff Report

Morris reported that the Council had approved the proposed resolutions recommended by the Commission at the Special Session. Morris reviewed the meeting with Ms. Williamson from the Housing Department in Sedona who has suggested a joint regional application CDBG funding from the State for attainable housing; that may be worth looking at for the future since Camp Verde is already in the process of individually applying for funding. Morris also commented on the hard work being done by the Loan Committee. He announced that the Youth Commission will be meeting this Thursday where the Housing Commission will make the last of the presentations regarding the five-acre site.



On a motion by Ellington, seconded by Goetting, the Commission unanimously selected Steve Goetting to serve as liaison for future Housing Commission work sessions held in connection with drafting an RFP.

Parks & Recreation Commissioner Moore explained that during the recent presentation by Matt Morris of the Housing Department to all the Commissions and Boards, each group was invited to select a member to act as a liaison to provide input during the drafting of a Request for Proposal. The RFP would set forth guidelines for prespective developers of the Town-owned five-acre parcel of property next to the Views development. Input from a liaison from the Parks & Rec Commission would be helpful in including a request that part of the project be set aside for open space, or a pocket park. After discussion, Commissioner Goetting volunteered to act as liaison to the Housing Commission during the drafting of the RFP Moore confirmed that the Housing Commission meets on the third Tuesday of each month at 4:00 p.m.

9. Update and discussion on upcoming events and programs hosted by Parks and Recreation for the months of June and July Discussion may include but is not limited to Family Fun Night, Father/Child Golf, Movie Night Independence Day, Sunmer Program and Cornfest.

Moore outlined the activities and refreshments planned for the Family Fun Night scheduled for Saturday evening, from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., at the Pool and the Skate Park and the Father/Child Golf Tournament set for June 14th. One of the new summer programs will be Movie Night, with the first showing planned for June 28th at Butler Park, complete with various snacks and refreshments; the movies will be rated either G or GP, and suggestions are invited. Moore added that in July, staff is hoping to show Kingdom of the Spider Reunion; the possibility of inviting some screen notables was also suggested by the members. Moore also reviewed plans for a bus trip on July 17th to attend a Diamondbacks game, the upcoming Farmers Market from June 7th through the first week in October. Moore said that the Corn Fest plans are underway, and commented on what promises to be a successful Summer Program with as many as 60 children expected to sign up.

10. Update and discussion on the Development of Black Bridge Park.

Moore said that clearance from Arizona State Parks has been received to begin work at the Park. The archaeological dig has been completed, and staff is in the process of coordinating with the archaeological entity and the Street Department the final steps necessary to restore the area, including covering trenches, with an archaeologist on site during that phase. The Street Department will also be working on constructing the new road. Moore also reviewed the planned fencing of the area, picnic tables, trash containers and restroom facilities. Moore added that more people every day are already beginning to enjoy the area and the river.

11. Update, discussion and invitation for Commission members to attend a Special Session on June 11, 2008 at 4:00 pm with Ed Bantel with Southwest Risk.

Moore explained that Ed Bantel had given a presentation a few weeks ago that pointed

up all the shortfalls in the Parks & Recreation Department in connection with public use of the park and Town property, including failing to require proof of insurance from vendors naming the Town as additional insured. On a positive note, in connection with a citizen complaint about the Skate Park, Moore said that according to Mr. Bantel staff is handling the Skate Park in the way it should be dealt with; she hopes everyone will be able to attend the Special Session on June 11th for a better understanding of the liability issues.

12. Director's Report & Discussion.

Moore annoiunced that Parks & Recreation finally has access on My Space up and running, the e-mail address is CampVerdeParks@Yahoo.com. It will be ideal for getting word out to the youth on all the activities in store. Council has approved prohibition of alcohol at facility rentals; alcohol will be allowed at the Pecan & Wine Festival and Fort Verde Days events, it will be necessary for outside entities to request approval for alcohol use at all other events on a case-by-case basis. The theme for the Fort Verde Days parade was chosen: "Stories, Spirit and Spurs." Moore also reported on the work on lighting at Butler Park, replacement of outdoor chairs, and an invitation from the Fire Department to volunteers to act as citizen advocates to help make the community safe. Moore commented briefly on the status of negotiations on Sunnyside Park, and the exciting progress being made by the Youth Commission and the Boys & Girls Club on the rew Teen Center. Other items. Staff is working on an RFP for a consultant to work on a master plan for the new Community Park, due to budget cuts it will not be possible to continue with the open gyru, for the present, at least

13. Commission Informational Reports:

Tobish said that she is with the Camp Verde Youth Coalition; they are looking for more people, especially parents, to get involved to help work on the goals and objectives that have been set. To help acquaint the new Commissioners with the subject, Moore gave a brief overview of the need for the Teen Center and the purpose of the Youth Coalition.

Ellington reported on his grandchildren getting involved in the British Soccer program; he also commented on what he feels is the amazing professionalism of the teenage lifeguards at the pool.

Whatley commented on her visit to the Skate Park saying she found no problems whatsoever; in fact, the youngsters were polite and respectful, and there was no profanity. She also reported on the recent Relay for Life event, and the upcoming CCCVL event this Satirday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. to kick off water sales to raise funds for the new Library.

George said that the Library is holding a Book Sale on this coming Thursday.

14. Adjournment.

On a motion by Goetting, seconded by Tobish, the meeting was adjourned at 6:23 p.m.

Statistical Report

June's circulation statistics are as follows.

A total of 5837 items were circulated including 70 audio books, 170 kid's videos and 215 adult videos.

Physical Changes to the Current Library / New Library Developments

There was a problem with our electrical system on June 14th. It was an APS problem and we were only getting half the juice we needed to run the building. APS came to check things out and said that they would have to cut the power fro a couple of hours. We decided for safety reasons to close an hour early. Full power was restored by the next Tuesday.

Books Videos, Computer Updates

In June we added 214 items to the collection including 2 audio books and 18 videos. The new book list is now available on our website at www.cvaz.org/library Click on the "New Books List" link on our home page. We still have paper copies available here at the library.

Most of our staff computers have had anti-virus updates. 2 machines didn't have enough disc space for the update & are being cleaned out. They should be updated soon.

We are looking into purchasing items in electronic formats. We are looking at Playaways and Overdrive. As we get these formats, we will have information to explain them.

Programs & Activities

In June, we hosted 2 adult programs, 5 children's programs, 1 program for all ages. We had a total of 88 adults 15 teens and 130 children at our programs. We had about 149 volunteer hours donated in this department last month.

Funding & Fund Raising

We will continue talking with the Library Endowment Group about taking over the operation of our monthly book sale in September. We are operating the sale in the interim. In June we made about \$500.00 At the July sale we made about \$300.00

We now have a budget for 2008 / 09. We have enough money to operate at current service levels. No money was budgeted for new construction. In light of what is happening all around us, we did pretty well. The funds for our additional hours of service were put on hold until at least January.

The Basha's "Thanks A Million Program" is finished for another year. It should start up again some time in September. The number for the Library Endowment is 23066 and I will let you know when to link it to your "Thank You" card to that number. The Endowment gets a percentage of your shopping dollars.

I am also encouraging people to sign up for the e-Scrip program (number 152446398). If anyone has any questions, they may contact the library. You can also get more information on the Internet at http://www.escrip.com/ The eScrip program is nation wide and ongoing. The closest participants are Safeway Grocery Store, Office Max, and Servicemaster Clean in Cottonwood and New Frontiers Market in Sedona. The Town is now going through some tough financial times. I believe we can get through it without cutting anything.

Publicity

This month, publicity was still about our programming. The calendar of events continues to appear in the Bugle.

We continue to get the word out about our next book sale on every first Thursday of the month.

There was a fair amount of publicity for CCCVL's fundraising efforts and introducing them to the community

I had 1 meeting with members of CCCLV to prepare for a fundraising campaign.

The Library Network managers met on the 19th to evaluate the progress of our systems upgrade project. We decided to continue to mover forward with Sirsi-Dynix.

Alice attended a weeklong institute for non-degreed library workers. She returned with a lot of information and energized to do more & better. This is a 3 year program that will result in her being a certified paraprofessional.

Jan & Alice attended a network circulation meeting on the 13th. These meetings are a source of discussion and information sharing.

Miscellaneous Items

We will be renting the present location of our Beaver Creek Branch on a month-to-month basis. The Beaver Creek Regional Council is helping us to find a cheaper location and to get local support for the branch.

We now have a postage meter and site delivery and pick up of our mail. We are now getting the word out to all that our PO Box address is no longer valid.

June 2008 – Public Works Department

The Streets Division of Public Works has completed the annual Chip Seal maintenance of over 18 miles of road. By performing this valuable maintenance project, the crew helps to prolong pavement life and make traveling on the roads a bit smoother.

We get several calls when the street sweeper is run. This is an important maintenance activity serving several purposes. The sweeper keeps the roads clear of debris and potentially dangerous loose sand/rocks; this not only prolongs the pavement life it cuts down on chipped windshields and vehicle skids. Storm water pollution prevention is another benefit; it removes debris that would otherwise be washed into the Verde River during storms.

Please keep a watchful eye on weeds in your area or as you drive about. The Street Crew worked several days removing a large patch of Yellow Star Thistle. The weed was cited on Old Church Road and reported to us by an alert citizen. Yellow Star Thistle is a particularly invasive weed, and may be toxic to horses, your help to contain and remove it is very important. The crew is continuing to work in the Town Rights of Way to mow and cut weeds; please be aware of the workers and their equipment as you proceed caution.

Three new signs have been installed on Hwy 260 to warn trucks that use of their Engine Brake is prohibited in the Town.

The Town Engineer has been working to see that the Town Site Improvement Project (2nd to 6th Streets between Head and Hollamon) was started as quickly as possible after awarding the contract to Asphalt Paving and Supply (APS). The pavement overlay is now complete. The Streets Inspector will be conducting drainage tests in the area within the next week, so don't be surprised if you see water flowing for short intervals. New lights will be installed late August or early September.

Housing & Neighborhood Revitalization Department Monthly Report – July 2008

Revolving Loan Fund (RLF)

The Town's Housing Rehabilitation Program has currently four open loans from previous renovations. The fund continues to grow with monthly payments and interest earned in the savings account. The annual percentage yield earned in May in the savings account was .80%; the interest payment for May was \$127.29. The monthly payments in June raised the account balance by \$1560.84 for a grand total of \$195,873.77. The current balance owed by the program participants is \$198,843.46.

CV Owner Occupied Home Rehabilitation Program (OOHR)

On June 10th the OOHR Loan Committee, which is comprised of three members of the Housing Commission, met to receive project reports prepared by the Housing Director for the eight qualified applicants to the program. They had one week to review the materials. The Committee met again on June 16th and June 17th to discuss the reports and make their final decisions.

As per the Camp Verde Housing Rehabilitation Program Guidelines, the Loan Committee first looked for applicants who showed repayment ability. Only one of the eight met this criterion and was approved for a low-interest repayable loan.

A second applicant, with limited repayment ability, was conditionally approved for a combination of repayable loan to refinance the existing mortgage out of the RLF, and Conditional Deferred Payment Loan (CDPL) to be financed out of HOME grant monies. This loan will be contingent on being able to complete the whole project, including the refinance, for less than the allowable project cap.

Three applicants who showed no repayment ability were approved for CDPLs to be paid out of HOME grant funds.

All five of the home rehabilitation projects include total replacement of 1960's and 1970's era mobile homes. A sixth applicant was approved for possible remodeling of a 1983 manufactured home, contingent on the availability of funds after the completion of the first five projects.

In July, we will prepare work write-ups and meet with approved applicants, with the goal of advertising for bids on the approved projects in August.

We would like to thank our Housing Commissioners Tony Varela, Kathy Davis and John McReynolds, for their valuable community service as Loan Committee members. We are thankful for their dedication and commitment to the community.

Town Owned 5-Acre Site

In May, members of the Housing Commission and Mr.Morris attended meetings of all the Town Commissions and Boards to present information and solicit input for the Parkway Homes development on the Town owned five acre site located on Cliffs Parkway. Each Commission was also requested to appoint a liaison to attend future Housing Commission meetings to draft a Request for Proposals (RFP). The incorporation of liaisons will provide an opportunity for additional input from general interests' representative of the various Town Commissions.

Verde Valley Housing Taskforce (VVHT)

The VVHT meets regularly ever other month on the third Thursday of the month at 12:00 p.m. As such, the next regular VVHT meeting is tentatively scheduled for July 24th at the Yavapai County Cottonwood Annex building located in Cottonwood, and may include a presentation by the Yavapai-Apache Nation Housing Department regarding their ongoing housing efforts.

Camp Verde Housing Strategy & Summer Internship

The Housing Department Summer Intern, Liyu Wang, has spent the month of June updating outdated demographic data in the 1999 Camp Verde Housing Strategy. She has nearly completed this task, and will begin analyzing and drafting text to reflect these changes. In addition to updating the tables, Ms. Wang is also preparing GIS maps which display various town attributes and characteristics, which will be useful to understand spatially what is occurring in Camp Verde and the Verde Valley in general.

Camp Verde Safety Committee

On June 11th, Ed Bantel, Program Administrator of Southwest Risk/Arizona Municipal Risk Retention Pool, gave a presentation to the Town Council, Safety Committee and Department Heads on AMRRP history, programs, and Town coverage and services.

Items discussed during the regular meeting on June 3rd included the Maintenance Department having removed the sidewalk hazard in front of Mason Jewelry Store on Main Street, and the need to create handicapped accessible access to the Parks and Recreation conference room from the outside door, since the room is regularly used for Public Meetings.

Housing Commission & Staff Training

Given the current economic condition at the national, state and local town levels, we are researching training opportunities to gain personal finance and first time homebuyer education training expertise to enable our ability to provide educational sessions to housing program participants on these topics. Currently there is a high demand for both educational and counseling services in Camp Verde, which has been highly evident from recent applications received for our OOHR program. However, the availability of local organizations capable of providing personal finance and first time homebuyer education and counseling is limited mainly to organizations located outside of the Verde Valley. Therefore, to improve the success of the Town's Housing programs and to provide a much needed service, we are pursuing training opportunities. Ms. Goodwin has applied for a scholarship to attend a NeighborWorks (please see their web site for additional information: www.nw.org/) training course which will enable her to become certified in providing personal finance and first time homebuyer education. Having trained personnel on staff will allow the Town to provide educational opportunities which are designed to enhance current and future Housing programs.

This January, Mr. Morris applied to and was accepted into the Northern Arizona University Masters of Public Administration (MPA) program. Mr. Morris has completed his first course, Government Budgeting, during the first summer session with a grade of an "A" (98.5%). Mr. Morris also applied for and was awarded a Tuition Waiver Scholarship for the fall and spring 2008/09 semesters. Mr. Morris is currently enrolled in a second summer session focused on Administrative Law.

Mr. Morris has successfully completed the year long Verde Valley Leadership (VVL) program and is scheduled to graduate on July 25th. In addition, Mr. Morris was invited and officially voted on as an official Board Member of VVL.
